

Textiles Studies Elective: Design for Fashion

Task: You are to construct a garment for a client (you can be the client) taking into consideration forthcoming fashion trends, figure type, clothing requirements and the functional requirements of the garment. Costs should be kept comparable to retail costs for a similar garment and the aim should be to increase your skill level by challenging yourself. Embellishments may be added to a garment you construct to create interest or to enhance its fashion appeal. Your garment should be presented effectively including labelling and swing tags.

Task Guide: 1. Write a design brief including the specifications in your journal including your client/market

details and a fashion analysis for the forthcoming autumn season.

2. Identify and describe your client's figure type, sex, age, personal clothing preferences and wardrobe requirements that will need to be considered in your decision making. (Refer to class notes)
3. Research at least 2 **possible** solutions that may meet the design brief. Analyse each of these addressing the factors above.
 - Include design sketches, pictures, photos
 - Include fabric choices and the properties of these fabric swatches.
 - Include notion alternatives etc.
 - Include techniques
4. Make decisions (be sure to make decisions on all of the following)
 1. Garment and design (include a picture or sketch of your design)
 2. Fabrics (include samples and/or state fibre composition)
 3. Embellishments (if applicable)
 4. Techniques (include explanation and/or samples)
 5. Notions used

5. **Justify each of your decisions in detail** analysing how your choices satisfies each of the factors you identified in steps 1 and 2.

This is the most important part of your journal and should be extensive and detailed.

6. Create a construction plan to complete your garment. (Refer to class notes)
7. Construct and/or embellish your garment.
8. Present your item appropriately pressed including labelling and swing tag. (Refer to class notes)
9. Evaluate all the decisions, processes, and issues throughout your construction processes.

Acknowledge how well your article reflects your design brief, how successfully it meets your client's figure type, the forthcoming fashion trends and how functional the product is. Make suggestions and recommendations as to how you could improve your performance in the future.
