**TASK:**

Students are to prepare a multi media seminar that will analyse, evaluate and compare the influence of Bob Fosse's work, on the dance styles studied in class. This will include a detailed analysis and interpretation of a selected piece of Fosse's choreography work. Students are then to briefly outline using evaluative statements Fosse's influence on other dance styles/artists studied in class.

**CONDITIONS**

- Students will be given 6 lessons in class time of complete the task and consult the teacher for feedback.
- Use of power point presentations, pictures, posters and videos/ should be incorporated into the presentation.
- A hard copy of your script and power point presentation must be submitted on the day
- All source material (videos, web pages etc.) must be referenced
- Draft copies can be submitted prior to the assessment day.
- Students presentations will be videoed on the day
